Russian connection a hit for White Cliff

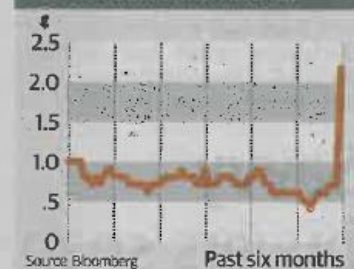

After yesterday's market response, White Cliff Minerals managing director Todd Hibberd may have to learn a little more Russian.

The Perth-based explorer sparked a frenzy yesterday after reporting high-grade hits at its Chanach gold-copper project in the Russian-speaking Kyrgyz Republic (bordered by Kazakhstan to the north, Uzbekistan to the west, Tajikistan to the south-west and China to the east).

The highlights included a reported find of 7m at 3.83 per cent copper and 30.1 grams of gold, pushing its shares up 1.5¢ to 2.2¢
