Notice is given that the Meeting will be held at:

The business of the Meeting affects your shareholding and your vote is important.

This Notice of Meeting should be read in its entirety. If Shareholders are in doubt as to how they should vote, they should seek advice from their professional advisers prior to voting.

The Directors have determined pursuant to Regulation 7.11.37 of the Corporations Regulations 2001 (Cth) that the persons eligible to vote at the Meeting are those who are registered Shareholders at 11:00am (WST) on 28 July 2020.

BUSINESS OF THE MEETING

AGENDA

1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

To receive and consider the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ended 31 December 2019 together with the declaration of the Directors, the Directors' report, the Remuneration report and the Auditor's report.

2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as a **non-binding resolution**:

“That, for the purposes of section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, approval is given for the adoption of the Remuneration report as contained in the Company's annual financial report for the financial year ended 31 December 2019.”

Note: the vote on this Resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

Voting Prohibition Statement:

A vote on this Resolution must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of either of the following persons:

- (a) a member of the Key Management Personnel, details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration report; or
- (b) a Closely Related Party of such a member.

However, a person (the **voter**) described above may cast a vote on this Resolution as a proxy if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person described above and either:

- (a) the voter is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- (b) the voter is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair as proxy:
 - (i) does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; and
 - (ii) expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even though this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MILES KENNEDY

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

“That, for the purpose of clause 6.3(c) of the Constitution and for all other purposes, Mr Miles Kennedy, a Director, retires by rotation, and being eligible, is re-elected as a Director.”

4. RESOLUTION 3 – APPROVAL OF 10% PLACEMENT CAPACITY

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as a **special resolution**:

“That, for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 7.1A and for all other purposes, approval is given for the Company to issue up to that number of Equity Securities equal to 10% of the issued capital of the Company at the time of issue, calculated in accordance with the formula prescribed in ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.2 and otherwise on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement.”

5. RESOLUTION 4 – RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ISSUE OF SHARES TO EQUIGOLD PTE LTD

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

“That, for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 7.4 and for all other purposes, Shareholders ratify the issue of 3,223,350 Shares on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement.”

Voting Exclusion: The Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of the Resolution by or on behalf of Equigold Pte Ltd or an associate of Equigold Pte Ltd. However, this does not apply to a vote cast in favour of a Resolution by:

- (a) a person as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with the directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the Resolution in that way; or
- (b) the Chair as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with a direction given to the Chair to vote on the Resolution as the Chair decides; or
- (c) a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - (i) the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on the Resolution; and
 - (ii) the holder votes on the Resolution in accordance with the directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote that way.

6. RESOLUTION 5 – RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ISSUE OF SHARES UNDER PLACEMENT

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

“That, for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 7.4 and for all other purposes, Shareholders ratify the issue of 25,899,916 Shares on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement.”

Voting Exclusion: The Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of the Resolution by or on behalf of a person who participated in the issue or an associate of that person (or those persons). However, this does not apply to a vote cast in favour of the Resolution by:

- (a) a person as a proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with the directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the Resolution in that way; or
- (b) the Chair as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with a direction given to the Chair to vote on the Resolution as the Chair decides; or
- (c) a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - (i) the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on the Resolution; and
 - (ii) the holder votes on the Resolution in accordance with directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

Attendance and participation

Due to the uncertainty and potential health risks posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, the Company encourages Shareholders not to attend the meeting in person and participate in the Meeting via proxy voting and the ability to submit questions in advance of the Meeting which will be addressed at the Meeting.

The Company and venue must adhere to all social distancing measures at the Meeting prescribed by government authorities. Further details on any possible attendance at the Meeting will be monitored, announced to the ASX and made available on the Company's website www.lucapa.com.au prior to the Meeting.

The Company welcomes the participation of Shareholders in the Meeting. Shareholders are invited to lodge questions in advance of the Meeting by sending an email containing their question(s) to general@lucapa.com.au by 5pm (WST) on 27 July 2020. As many of the emailed questions as possible will be addressed during the Meeting. Please note that individual responses will not be sent to Shareholders.

Voting procedure

Voting on all proposed resolutions at the Meeting will be conducted by poll. Under the Company's constitution (**Constitution**), any poll will be conducted as directed by the Chair.

Shareholders can vote in one of two ways:

- by attending the Meeting and voting; or
- by appointing a proxy or attorney to attend and vote on their behalf.

Voting in person or by attorney

As previously stated, Shareholders, or their attorneys, are discouraged from attending in person but those who do choose to do so are asked to arrive at the venue 15 minutes prior to the time designated for the Meeting, if possible, so that the Company may check their Shareholding against the Company's share register and note attendances.

Voting by proxy

To vote by proxy, please complete and sign the enclosed Proxy Voting Form and return by the time and in accordance with the instructions set out on the Proxy Voting Form.

In accordance with section 249L of the Corporations Act, Shareholders are advised that:

- each Shareholder has a right to appoint a proxy;
- the proxy need not be a Shareholder of the Company; and
- a Shareholder who is entitled to cast 2 or more votes may appoint 2 proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise. If the member appoints 2 proxies and the appointment does not specify the proportion or number of the member's votes, then in accordance with section 249X(3) of the Corporations Act, each proxy may exercise one-half of the votes.

Shareholders and their proxies should be aware that changes to the Corporations Act made in 2011 mean that:

- if proxy holders vote, they must cast all directed proxies as directed; and
- any directed proxies which are not voted will automatically default to the Chair, who must vote the proxies as directed.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

In accordance with the Constitution, the business of the Meeting will include receipt and consideration of the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ended 31 December 2019 together with the declaration of the Directors, the Directors' report, the Remuneration report and the Auditor's report.

The Company will not provide a hard copy of the Company's annual financial report to Shareholders unless specifically requested to do so. The Company's annual financial report is available on its website at www.lucapa.com.au.

2. RESOLUTION 1 - ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

2.1 General

The Corporations Act requires that at a listed company's annual general meeting, a resolution that the remuneration report be adopted must be put to the shareholders. However, such a resolution is advisory only and does not bind the company or the directors of the company.

The remuneration report sets out a company's remuneration arrangements for the directors and senior management of the company. The remuneration report is part of the directors' report contained in the annual financial report of the company for a financial year.

Shareholders will be given the opportunity to ask questions about or make comments on the Remuneration report.

2.2 Voting consequences

A company is required to put to its shareholders a resolution proposing the calling of another meeting of shareholders to consider the appointment of directors of the company (**Spill Resolution**) if, at consecutive annual general meetings, at least 25% of the votes cast on a remuneration report resolution are voted against adoption of the remuneration report and at the first of those annual general meetings a Spill Resolution was not put to vote. If required, the Spill Resolution must be put to vote at the second of those annual general meetings.

If more than 50% of votes cast are in favour of the Spill Resolution, the company must convene a shareholder meeting (**Spill Meeting**) within 90 days of the second annual general meeting.

All of the directors of the company who were in office when the directors' report (as included in the company's annual financial report for the most recent financial year) was approved, other than the managing director of the company, will cease to hold office immediately before the end of the Spill Meeting but may stand for re-election at the Spill Meeting.

Following the Spill Meeting those persons whose election or re-election as directors of the company is approved will be the directors of the company.

2.3 Previous voting results

At the Company's previous annual general meeting the votes cast against the remuneration report considered at that annual general meeting were less than 25%. Accordingly, the Spill Resolution is not relevant for this annual general meeting.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MR MILES KENNEDY

3.1 General

The Constitution sets out the requirements for determining which Directors are to retire by rotation at an annual general meeting.

Mr Miles Kennedy, who has served as a Director since 12 September 2008 and was last re-elected on 24 May 2018, retires by rotation and seeks re-election.

3.2 Qualifications and other material directorships

Mr Kennedy has held directorships of Australian listed companies for more than 30 years. He was previously Chairman of companies including Sandfire Resources, Kimberley Diamond Company, Blina Diamonds, Macraes Mining Company, MOD Resources and RNI. He has extensive experience in the management of public companies with specific emphasis in the resources industry. He lives in Quedjinup, Western Australia.

3.3 Independence

The Board considers that whilst Mr Kennedy has served as a Director for a long period, he remains independent from management and substantial Shareholders and is therefore able to bring an independent judgement to bear on issues before the Board and to act in the best interests of the Company as a whole rather than in the interests of an individual Shareholder or other party. If re-elected the Board considers Mr Kennedy will be an independent Director.

3.4 Board recommendation

Following the annual review of the performance of directors conducted by the Board, the Board (excluding Mr Kennedy) supports the re-election of Mr Miles Kennedy and recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2. The Board considers that Mr Kennedy provides an important contribution to the Board, given his professional background, extensive experience in the diamond industry and important relationships established with Government and private partners.

4. RESOLUTION 3 – APPROVAL OF 10% PLACEMENT CAPACITY

4.1 General

ASX Listing Rule 7.1 provides that a company must not, subject to specified exceptions, issue or agree to issue, without approval of its shareholders, more equity securities during any 12 month period than that amount which represents 15% of the number of fully paid ordinary securities on issue at the commencement of that 12 month period.

In addition, ASX Listing Rule 7.1A provides that an Eligible Entity (as defined below) may seek shareholder approval by way of special resolution passed at an annual general meeting, to have the capacity to issue up to that number of Equity Securities (as defined below) equal to 10% of its issued capital (**10% Placement Capacity**) without using that company's existing 15% annual placement capacity granted under ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

An Eligible Entity is one that, as at the date of the relevant annual general meeting:

- (a) is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index; and
- (b) has a maximum market capitalisation (excluding restricted securities and securities quoted on a deferred settlement basis) of \$300 million.

An Equity Security is a share, a unit in a trust, a right to a share or unit in a trust or option, an option over an issued or unissued security, a convertible security, or, any security that ASX decides to classify as an equity security.

Any Equity Securities issued under the 10% Placement Capacity must be in the same class as an existing class of quoted Equity Securities. As at the date of this Notice, the Company currently has two classes of quoted Equity Securities on issue, being the Shares (ASX Code: LOM) and Options (ASX Code: LOMOC).

Resolution 3 seeks Shareholder approval by way of a special resolution for the Company to have the additional 10% Placement Capacity provided for in ASX Listing Rule 7.1A to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval.

4.2 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 14.1A

If Resolution 3 is passed, the Company will be able to issue Equity Securities up to the combined 25% limit in ASX Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A without any further Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 3 is not passed, the Company will not be able to access the additional 10% capacity to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A, and will remain subject to the 15% limit on issuing Equity Securities without Shareholder approval set out in ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

4.3 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 7.1A

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.3A, the information below is provided in relation to this Resolution 3:

(a) Minimum price

Any Equity Securities issued under the 10% Placement Capacity must be in an existing quoted class of Equity Securities and be issued at a minimum price of 75% of the volume weighted average price of Equity Securities in that class, calculated over the 15 ASX trading days on which trades in that class were recorded immediately before:

- (i) the date on which the price at which the Equity Securities are to be issued is agreed by the Company and the recipient of the Equity Securities; or
- (ii) if the Equity Securities are not issued within 10 ASX trading days of the date in Section 4.3(a)(i), the date on which the Equity Securities are issued.

(b) Date of issue

The Equity Securities may be issued under the 10% Placement Capacity commencing on the date of the Meeting and expiring on the first to occur of the following:

- (i) the date that is 12 months after the date of this Meeting;
- (ii) the time and date of the Company's next annual general meeting; and
- (iii) the time and date of approval by Shareholders of any transaction under ASX Listing Rule 11.1.2 (a significant change to the nature or scale of the Company's activities) or ASX Listing Rule 11.2 (disposal of the Company's main undertaking).

(c) Risk of voting dilution

Any issue of Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Capacity will dilute the interests of Shareholders who do not receive any Shares under the issue.

If Resolution 3 is approved by Shareholders and the Company issues the maximum number of Equity Securities available under the 10% Placement Capacity, the economic and voting dilution of existing Shares would be as shown in the table below.

The table below shows the dilution of existing Shareholders calculated in accordance with the formula outlined in ASX Listing Rule 7.1A(2), on the basis of the closing market price of Shares and the number of Equity Securities on issue as at 22 June 2020.

The table also shows the voting dilution impact where the number of Shares on issue (Variable A in the formula) changes and the economic dilution where there are changes in the issue price of Shares issued under the 10% Placement Capacity.

*The number of Shares on issue (Variable A in the formula) could increase as a result of the issue of Shares that do not require Shareholder approval (such as under a pro-rata rights issue or scrip issued under a takeover offer) or that are issued with Shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

The table above uses the following assumptions:

1. There are 630,615,132 Shares on issue.
2. The issue price set out above is the closing price of the Shares on the ASX on 22 June 2020.
3. The Company issues the maximum possible number of Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Capacity.
4. The Company has not issued any Equity Securities in the 12 months prior to the Meeting that were not issued under an exception in ASX Listing Rule 7.2 or with approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1.
5. The issue of Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Capacity consists only of Shares. It is assumed that no Options are exercised into Shares before the date of issue of the Equity Securities.
6. The calculations above do not show the dilution that any one particular Shareholder will be subject to. All Shareholders should consider the dilution caused to their own shareholding depending on their specific circumstances.
7. This table does not set out any dilution pursuant to approvals under ASX Listing Rule 7.1.
8. The 10% voting dilution reflects the aggregate percentage dilution against the issued share capital at the time of issue. This is why the voting dilution is shown in each example as 10%.
9. The table does not show an example of dilution that may be caused to a particular Shareholder by reason of placements under the 10% Placement Capacity, based on that Shareholder's holding at the date of the Meeting.

Shareholders should note that there is a risk that:

- (i) the market price for the Company's Shares may be significantly lower on the issue date than on the date of the Meeting; and
- (ii) the Shares may be issued at a price that is at a discount to the market price for those Shares on the date of issue.

(d) **Use of funds raised under 10% Placement Capacity**

The Company may issue Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Capacity as cash consideration in which case the Company intends to use funds raised to further its strategy of growing as a niche producer of high-quality diamonds. Funds raised could be used to expand capacity at the producing mines at Lulo (Angola) and Mothae (Lesotho), to further the kimberlite exploration activities on the Lulo (Angola), to advance the exploration programs at Brooking (Western Australia) and Orapa Area F (Botswana) or for general working capital and corporate administration costs or for the acquisition of new resource assets and investments.

The Company will comply with the disclosure obligations under Listing Rules 7.1A(4) and 3.10.5A upon issue of any Equity Securities.

(e) **Allocation policy under the 10% Placement Capacity**

The recipients of the Equity Securities to be issued under the 10% Placement Capacity have not yet been determined. However, the recipients of Equity Securities could consist of current Shareholders or new investors (or both), none of whom will be related parties of the Company.

The Company will determine the recipients at the time of the issue under the 10% Placement Capacity, having regard to the following factors:

- (i) the purpose of the issue;
- (ii) alternative methods for raising funds available to the Company at that time, including, but not limited to, an entitlement issue or other offer where existing Shareholders may participate;
- (iii) the effect of the issue of the Equity Securities on the control of the Company;
- (iv) the circumstances of the Company, including, but not limited to, the financial position and solvency of the Company;
- (v) prevailing market conditions; and
- (vi) advice from corporate, financial and broking advisers (if applicable).

Further, if the Company is successful in acquiring new resources, assets or investments, it is likely that the vendors of the new resources, assets or investments will receive cash consideration raised (in whole or in part) from the issue of Equity Securities to recipients under the 10% Placement Capacity.

(f) **Previous approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A**

The Company previously obtained approval from its Shareholders pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1A at its annual general meeting held on 27 May 2019 (**Previous Approval**).

The Company has not issued, or agreed to issue, any Equity Securities pursuant to the Previous Approval.

4.4 Voting exclusion

As at the date of this Notice, the Company is not proposing to make an issue of Equity Securities under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A. Accordingly, a voting exclusion statement is not included in respect of this Resolution 3.

5. RESOLUTION 4 – RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ISSUE OF SHARES TO EQUIGOLD PTE LTD

5.1 Equigold Loan Facility

As announced on 9 October 2017, the Company secured an initial US\$15 million financing facility with Equigold Pte Ltd (**Equigold**) to develop Phase 1 of the Mothae kimberlite diamond project in Lesotho (**Equigold Loan Facility**).

In accordance with the terms of the Equigold Loan Facility, the Company, at its election, can convert fees and quarterly interest into ordinary shares in the Company at the then market price.

Other material terms of the Equigold Loan Facility are as follows:

- (a) Total current principal loan facility of US\$7.3 million;
- (b) The principal balance is repayable in eight quarterly payments commencing April 2020;
- (c) Market related fees are payable on draw down and with interest payments;
- (d) Equigold, at its election, can convert the last two quarterly payments into ordinary shares in the Company at the then market price;
- (e) Interest is payable at 13%;
- (f) Lucapa, at its election, can convert fees and quarterly interest into ordinary shares in the Company at the then market price; and
- (g) The loan is secured by way of a General Security Deed granted by Lucapa in favour of the lender over collateral consisting of all the Company's investment in and loan to Mothae Diamonds (Pty) Ltd.

5.2 General

Pursuant to the Equigold Loan Facility, the Company issued 3,223,350 Shares at a deemed issue price of \$0.147 on 1 October 2019 in satisfaction of accrued fees and quarterly interest payments to the value of US\$320,753 (**Equigold Shares**).

5.3 ASX Listing Rules 7.1, 7.1A and 7.4

ASX Listing Rule 7.1 provides that a company must not, subject to specified exceptions, issue or agree to issue, without approval of its shareholders, more equity securities during any 12 month period than that amount which represents 15% of the number of fully paid ordinary securities on issue at the commencement of that 12 month period.

ASX Listing Rule 7.1A provides that in addition to issues permitted without prior shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1, an entity that is eligible and obtains shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A may issue or agree to issue during the period for which the approval is valid a number of quoted equity securities which represents 10% of the number of fully paid ordinary securities on issue at the commencement of that 12 month period as adjusted in accordance with the formula in ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

Where an eligible entity obtains shareholder approval to increase its placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A then any ordinary securities issued under that additional placement capacity:

- (a) will not be counted in variable “A” in the formula in ASX Listing Rule 7.1A; and
- (b) are counted in variable “E”,

until their issue has been ratified under ASX Listing Rule 7.4 (and provided that the previous issue did not breach ASX Listing Rule 7.1A) or 12 months has passed since their issue.

The Company's ability to use the additional 10% placement capacity for issues of Equity Securities following this Meeting is subject to the passing of Resolution 3.

As the issue of Equigold Shares, does not fall within any of the specified exceptions to ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and has not yet been approved by Shareholders, it effectively uses up part of the Company's 15% placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and 10% placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A (as applicable), reducing the Company's capacity to issue further equity securities without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the date of issue of the Equigold Shares.

Under ASX Listing Rule 7.4, if a company's shareholders approve an issue of equity securities after it has been made or agreed to be made, that issue or agreement to issue equity securities is treated as having been made with Shareholder approval for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 7.1 (provided that the issue or agreement did not breach ASX Listing Rule 7.1).

The Company wishes to retain as much flexibility as possible to issue additional Equity Securities in the future without having to obtain Shareholder approval for such issues under ASX Listing Rule 7.1. Accordingly, the Company is seeking Shareholder ratification pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the Equigold Shares.

Resolution 4 seeks Shareholder ratification pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the Equigold Shares.

5.4 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 14.1A

If Resolution 4 is not passed, the Equigold Shares will be included in calculating the Company's 15% placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and, if Resolution 3 is passed, its 10% placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities that the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the date of issue of the Equigold Shares.

If Resolution 4 is passed, the base figure (i.e. variable “A”) on which the Company's 15% placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and, if Resolution 3 is passed, its 10% placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A, is calculated will be a higher number which in turn will allow a proportionately higher number of equity securities to be issued by the Company without prior Shareholder approval.

5.5 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 7.5

- (f) the purpose of the issue of the Equigold Shares was in lieu of the payment of interest and fees under the Equigold Loan Facility;
- (g) the Equigold Shares were issued under the Equigold Loan Facility. A summary of the material terms of the Equigold Loan Facility is set out in Section 5.1 above; and
- (h) a voting exclusion statement is included in Resolution 4 of this Notice.

6. RESOLUTION 5 – RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ISSUE OF SHARES UNDER PLACEMENT

6.1 General

On 4 March 2020, the Company announced that it had received applications to raise approximately \$2.8 million (before costs) via the issue of 25,899,916 Shares to sophisticated and professional investors pursuant to section 708 of the Corporations Act at an issue price of \$0.11 per Share (**Placement**). The Shares under the Placement were issued pursuant to the Company's 15% placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

Funds raised under the Placement will allow for the advancement of the Lulo kimberlite exploration program and for general working capital and corporate purposes. The Placement was lead managed by Far East Capital Limited (ACN 068 838 193; AFSL 253003) (**FEC**).

6.2 ASX Listing Rules 7.1, 7.1A and 7.4

ASX Listing Rule 7.1 provides that a company must not, subject to specified exceptions, issue or agree to issue, without approval of its shareholders, more equity securities during any 12 month period than that amount which represents 15% of the number of fully paid ordinary securities on issue at the commencement of that 12 month period.

ASX Listing Rule 7.1A provides that in addition to issues permitted without prior shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1, an entity that is eligible and obtains shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A may issue or agree to issue during the period for which the approval is valid a number of quoted equity securities which represents 10% of the number of fully paid ordinary securities on issue at the commencement of that 12 month period as adjusted in accordance with the formula in ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

Where an eligible entity obtains shareholder approval to increase its placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1A then any ordinary securities issued under that additional placement capacity:

- (a) will not be counted in variable "A" in the formula in Listing Rule 7.1A; and
- (b) are counted in variable "E",

until their issue has been ratified under Listing Rule 7.4 (and provided that the previous issue did not breach Listing Rule 7.1A) or 12 months has passed since their issue.

The Company's ability to use the additional 10% placement capacity for issues of Equity Securities following this Meeting is subject to the passing of Resolution 3.

As the issue of Shares under the Placement, does not fall within any of the specified exceptions to ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and has not yet been approved by Shareholders, it effectively uses up part of the Company's 15% placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and 10% placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A (as applicable), reducing the Company's capacity to issue further equity securities without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the date of issue of those Shares.

Under ASX Listing Rule 7.4, if a company's shareholders approve an issue of equity securities after it has been made or agreed to be made, that issue or agreement to issue equity securities

is treated as having been made with Shareholder approval for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 7.1 (provided that the issue or agreement did not breach ASX Listing Rule 7.1).

The Company wishes to retain as much flexibility as possible to issue additional equity securities in the future without having to obtain Shareholder approval for such issues under ASX Listing Rule 7.1. Accordingly, the Company is seeking Shareholder ratification pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the Shares under the Placement, the subject of Resolution 5.

Resolution 5 seeks Shareholder ratification pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of Shares under the Placement.

6.3 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 14.1A

If Resolution 5 is not passed, the Shares will be included in calculating the Company's 15% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1 and its 10% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1A, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities that the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the date of issue of the Shares.

If Resolution 5 is passed, the base figure (i.e. variable "A") in which the Company's 15% placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and, if Resolution 3 is passed, its 10% placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A is calculated will be a higher number which in turn will allow a proportionately higher number of equity securities to be issued by the Company without prior Shareholder approval.

None of the recipients are related parties of the Company;
- (b) 25,899,916 Shares were issued pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1;
- (c) the Shares issued were all fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company issued on the same terms and conditions as the Company's existing Shares;
- (d) the Shares were issued on 10 March 2020;
- (e) the issue price was \$0.11 per Share;
- (f) the purpose of the issue was to raise approximately \$2.8 million (before costs), which will be applied to the advancement of the Lulo kimberlite exploration program and for general working capital and corporate purposes;
- (g) the Shares were not issued under an agreement; and
- (h) a voting exclusion statement is included in Resolution 5 of this Notice.
